Dear Friends.

I hope most of you have been able to keep up with church news through the church website or friends. We are still limited to 50 people on a Sunday and it feels very strange to cover our faces and worship without singing. However it is



amazing how well we have adapted to these changes, and with hope of a vaccine on the horizon, perhaps not for too much longer. There are other changes on the horizon, which will affect us all. The Church of Scotland has been under pressure for a number of years with falling numbers of ministers and members, together with a drop in income, even before the pandemic. All Presbyteries are planning for change and more sharing of resources. Dundee Presbytery is planning for one future Parish of Broughty Ferry sharing two ministry staff.

As you know we began informal talks with our neighbouring congregations and our Kirk Session has agreed to work with St James and St Luke's & Queen Street. Formal talks have begun and we are waiting to hear back from Presbytery.

In the meantime I have made a key decision and decided that this is the right time for me to retire: not an easy decision even when I have reached the appropriate age, and especially when church life is hardly 'normal'. However it will allow planning decisions to be made more easily, and perhaps with all the other changes around us, one more will be less of an upheaval.

The date is not yet fixed, but I expect to step down in the first quarter of the new year. There is a lot to organise and plan in church and home life: a house move in these times is complicated! I hope there will be plenty of time to catch up in person before that. Meantime as we approach a very strange Christmas, remember that we are not alone, as it says in John's gospel:

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never put it out
